The British Association of Head and Neck Oncologists is a multidisciplinary society for healthcare professionals involved in the study and treatment of head and neck cancer.

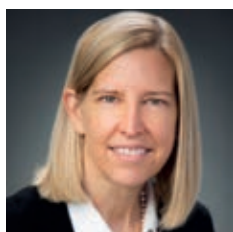

INVITED SPEAKER



PROFESSOR MAURA L. GILLISON
Department of Thoracic, Head and Neck, Medical Oncology
Division of Cancer Medicine Division
The University of Texas MD Anderson Cancer Center, Houston, USA

Professor Maura L. Gillison's laboratory focuses on the role of human papillomavirus (HPV) infection in head and neck malignancies. Her work ranges from cohort studies of oral HPV infection to genetic indicators of response to chemoradiotherapy.

Professor Gillison is a physician scientist and has made significant contributions to the identification of human papillomavirus as a cause of a distinct subset of head and neck cancer, resulting in a paradigm shift in concepts for risk, diagnosis and therapy of head and neck cancer. As a doctorate-level trained molecular epidemiologist and medical oncologist with expertise in head and neck cancer, she currently investigates the implications of our findings for primary and secondary prevention strategies, diagnostics, prognostics, genomics, molecular therapeutics, clinical decision making and population-level cancer incidence trends in the United States and worldwide.

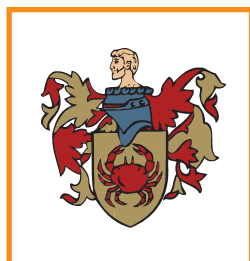

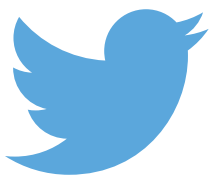

HONORARY MEMBERSHIP

Mr Michael Fardy FFDRCS FRCS FDSRCS FFSEM JP



Mike Fardy trained in East Grinstead under the mentorship of Andy Brown and Peter Banks and left to set up the Orofacial Cancer Unit at the University Hospital of Wales in Cardiff in 1995. He introduced the concept of free tissue transfer.

He has promoted Head and Neck services locally and was appointed Clinical director for UHW Head and Neck services, 2000–2004; Medical Director for Cancer Services for South East Wales Cancer Network, 2006– 2009.

Mike chaired sessions at the IAOMS meeting on Management of Orofacial cancer in Japan 1997 and regularly chairs sessions on Orofacial cancer management at the four-yearly International Head and Neck Conference in the USA/Canada. He has represented BAHNO on the council of the IA00.

In 2003 he was elected as a council member of BAHNO and was Hon Conference secretary for six years. Mike became Lead for Oncology for BAOMS 2014 – 2017 and the greatest honour was being elected as President for BAHNO (2015– 2017). He has been invited to review and advise on Head and Neck cancer service provision at many units in the UK.

In 2015, BAHNO in conjunction with Saving Faces had a tender accepted by HQIP to develop a new Head and Neck database to succeed DAHNO. As President of BAHNO, he became and remains Clinical lead for HANA.

Outside his work his main interests are rugby (being Maxillofacial Surgeon to the WRU and Cardiff Blues) and, most of all, his family who have supported him throughout.

Mr Nicholas J. Roland MBChB FRCSMD



Nick is a Consultant ENT/Head & Neck Surgeon at University Hospital Aintree, Liverpool where he served as Chair of the Head & Neck Cancer MDT and subsequently the Cancer Network Group (2004 –2012). He was the Royal College of Surgeons Regional Affairs Adviser for ENT (2003 –2012), an Intercollegiate examiner (2009 –2018), and has been heavily involved with surgical training throughout his career. He served on ENT UK Council and became the Chairman of ENT UK Head & Neck Society (2012–2015).

Nick has written and presented extensively. He has contributed to 12 textbooks and is first author of the postgraduate textbook Key Topics in Otolaryngology/Head & Neck Surgery; widely considered to be the Exam Bible, this has helped a generation of ENT surgeons to successfully navigate post-graduate exams, including the Intercollegiate examination. The third edition has been recently published (January 2019).

In 2009, he was appointed the National Lead to produce Multidisciplinary UK Consensus Guidelines for the Management of Head & Neck Cancer. He was the Co-lead Editor in its production in 2011 and 2016. This document is now regarded as a standard of care not only in the UK, but many other countries.

Nick was first elected to represent ENT at BAHNO Council in 2009 and became Honorary Secretary in 2011, a position he served with enthusiasm, intrinsically involved in the work of the Association throughout a tenure of 8 years.

PRESIDENT'S ACHIEVEMENT AWARDS

Prof. Kevin Harrington BSc(Hons) MBBS(Hons) MRCP FRCR FRCP DIC PhD FRSB



Kevin Harrington specialises in developing new treatments with a specific focus on head and neck cancer (HNC). His twin research interests are oncolytic virotherapy/immunotherapy and targeted radiation sensitisers. In the field of oncolytic virotherapy, he has helped develop talimogene laherparepvec, reovirus, coxsackie A21 and vaccinia virus. His research interests in immunotherapy include immune checkpoint inhibitors (PD-1, PD-L1, LAG-3 and CTLA-4 inhibitors) and innate immune activators (e.g. STING agonists). He has been Principal Investigator of phase I, II and III studies of novel agents in HNC. He leads a programme of pre-clinical and clinical research in targeted radiosensitisers (Chk1i, HSP90i, ATRi), including a first-in-man phase I study of the ATR inhibitor, AZD6738.

In 2016, he was appointed as a NIHR Senior Investigator. He is Head of the Division of Radiotherapy and Imaging at The Institute of Cancer Research/Royal Marsden Hospital, Biomedical Research Centre theme lead for radiotherapy research and Director for the Wellcome/CRUK Clinical Research Programme at ICR. He is also an Honorary Consultant Clinical Oncologist at The Royal Marsden NHS Foundation Trust.

He studied medicine at St Bartholomew's Hospital, London and conducted PhD studies on liposomal drug targeting at Hammersmith Hospital. He completed post-doctoral research in the Molecular Medicine Program at the Mayo Clinic, Minnesota before joining the ICR in 2001 as leader of the Targeted Therapy Team. Kevin Harrington is a Fellow of the Royal College of Physicians and of the Royal College of Radiologists. He has published more than 480 peer-reviewed papers, 45 book chapters and has edited 3 books.

Mr John C. Watkinson MSc MS FRCS DLO



John Watkinson qualified from the Royal Free Hospital (UCL) and trained in ENT, Head & Neck and Plastic Surgery at Guys and the Royal Marsden. He has Fellowships in General Surgery and Otolaryngology, a MSc in Nuclear Medicine and a MS in Surgery. From 1992-2017 he was a Consultant Head and Neck and Thyroid surgeon at the Queen Elizabeth Hospital, Birmingham where he had a large clinical and research thyroid practice. He also worked at the Royal Marsden Hospital, Chelsea, London (2016-2017). He has helped orchestrate or supervise over 30 Higher Degrees, published widely and in 1998 was Hospital Surgical Doctor of the Year. He has been involved in a number of National Guidelines, and organised the Birmingham Head and Neck course (1997-2006).

He is Chief Editor of both the textbooks Stell and Maran and Scott Brown and recent author of the neck section in Gray's Anatomy. He was President of BAHNO; 2009-2011, and then President of BAETS; 2011-2013. He was also President of the RSM Section of Laryngology (2014-2015) and Chair of the Semon Lecture Committee (UCL) from 2013-2017. John has given a number of eponymous lectures, which include the Stell, John Palmer, the Leegard, Hunterian, the Wilde Discourse, RSM Presidential Address and the Thomas Tatum Lecture. In 1994, he helped co-found The Get A-Head Charitable Trust.

He is married with two children, enjoys travelling, watching all sports, fishing and fine wine!

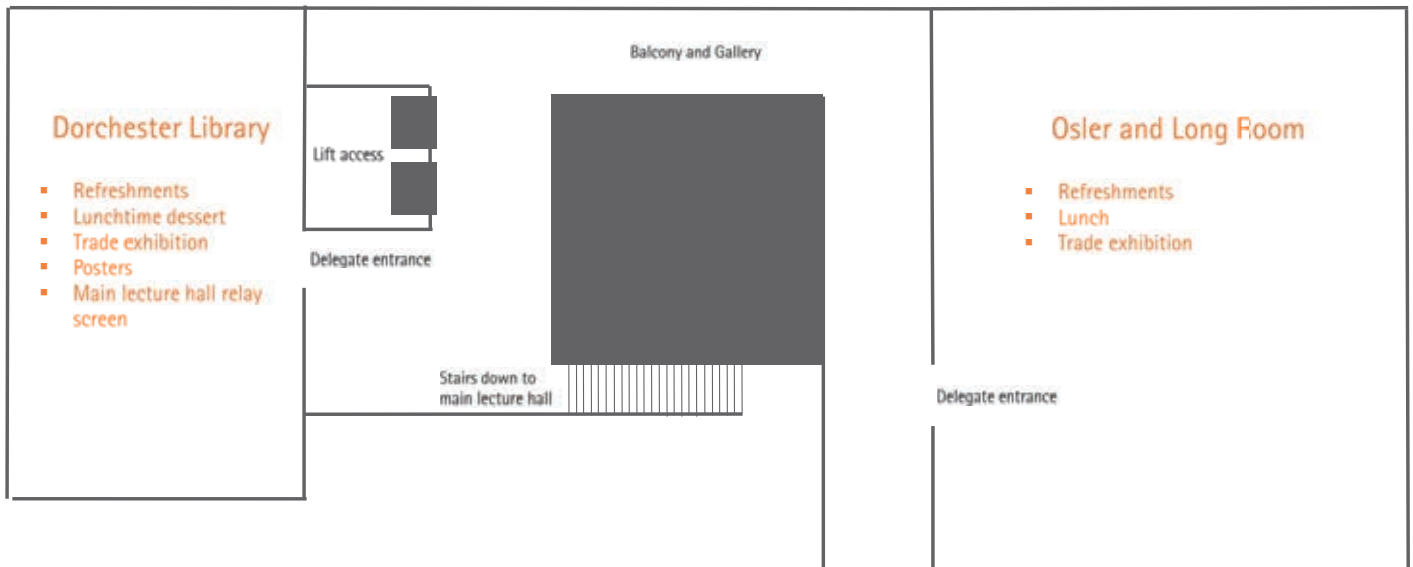
